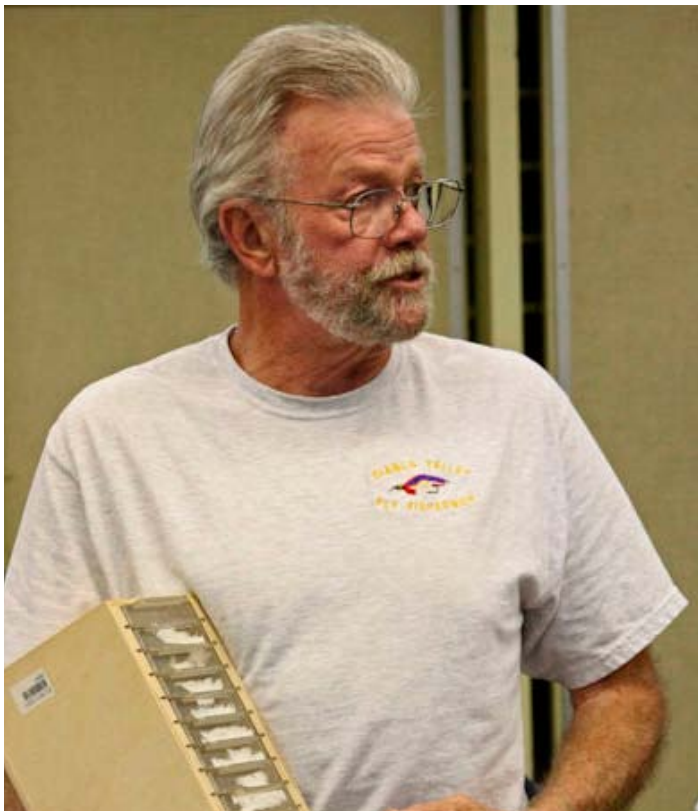

Carl “Boomer” Stout
THE GREEN RIVER IN UTAH



Boomer’s presentation will take you on a journey of the Green River and the surrounding Flaming Gorge area. Detailed handouts will be provided on how to get there, facilities and gear

needed for a great fishing experience. We will start at the top of the “a” section, right below the dam and travel on down river, seeing all 3 sections. At the end of the program, we will go into detail of the aquatic and terrestrial hatches, when they occur, and what flies to best take advantage of this. Some of these patterns are Boomer’s and Dennis Breer’s creations which boomer will tie in his pre-program tying demonstration.

Boomer then started guiding in Colorado in 1984. he then guided in Alaska at Katmai Lodge for four years. For the G. Loomis Rod Co. he appeared at the International Sportsman’s Expo Shows and in the Master Tying Theater. This led to shows on TV such as the “Outdoorsman” and magazine articles. Boomer is well known as a fly designer, even going overseas to Thailand to train fly tiers. He has designed many successful flies for Alaska and the Green River. He started at Trout Creek Flies in 1990, then became head guide, and has loved being on the Green River ever since.

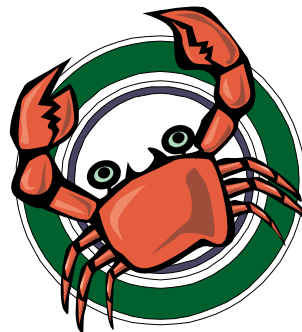

This action culminates 13 years of state and federal efforts, under the Clean Water Act, to develop pollution limits for 17 North Coast California bodies of water. Pyramid Lake Outing

March 8-11, 2011

This year's outing will be Tuesday afternoon through Friday to avoid the crowds that come for the last weekend before the "nets" close. Join us for some or all of these days. This is a great outing to catch large cutthroats and socialize with other club members. Some of us will be staying at Crosby's Lodge (775-476-0400) at Sutcliffe on the lake. Crosby's fills up quickly. Other options are a motel in Sparks/Reno or camping on the lake shore (it can be <30 F at night). Allow 45 minutes to drive to the lake from Sparks/Reno.

A tribal fishing permit (no NV license required) is needed, which can be purchased on the way to the lake at the store on the Southwest corner of Eagle Canyon Drive and Route 445, about 7.5 miles North of I-80. Permits and a some flies can also be bought in Sutcliffe. Fish barbless.

Fish are taken by stripping wooly buggers or beetles near the bottom or by floating a nymph 4- to 7- feet deep under an indicator. Gear: 6-9 wt rods with a fast sink shooting head or full sink line and a floating line for indicator fishing. A 6-foot, aluminum step ladder or 4- to 5- foot stepstool is needed. They are stable on the firm mud bottom. Tie a plastic jug to the ladder in case it falls over when unattended. Float tubing is also good when the wind is down. Bring warm clothes, lunch and a lawn chair. Weather during the day can vary from freezing to shirt-sleeves. Nasty weather usually means good fishing but Donner Pass can be a problem - bring tire chains.

We will probably meet at the "nets" south of Sutcliffe near the hatchery on most mornings. [The north and south "nets" by the hatchery are closed to fishing from March 15 to May 15.] I will have more information on fly patterns and meeting places for those who sign up. The number of attendees is not limited.

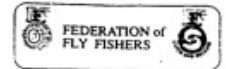
